# EDITOR'S NOTE

## WHEN THE CHEETAH OUTSMARTS THE HUNTER

This country is often derisively defined as a "Banana Republic." A place where chaos thrives so much that it becomes a wild circus. We, however, argue that Pakistan is not a Bananas Republic; on the contrary, its inability to protect its people because it chases the criminal so poorly makes it a "Chasing Cheetahs" republic.

Three incidents prove this point (all three unfortunately involve the victimization of women): the F-9 Park rape case, the wrongful arrest of a mother of two children, and the inhumane treatment of a family at the hands of a vicious feudal lord. In all these incidents, one thing is common: the inability to bring justice through proper channels.

Even worse, was the ill-thought-out diktat that kept these stories in the dark. Not only did it hurt the public, it also hurts the media's ability to report on sexual assault accurately. We are talking about PEMRA's banning of electronic media from reporting on this case. The effect was so far reaching that even newspapers (which were not part of the ban) had to tone down their reporting of this incident. This resulted in the public focusing on questioning the assailants' killing and forgetting the assault itself.

As if that weren't enough, a woman and her family were held captive and killed in a Baloch politician's private prison. This news would have been buried had it not been for social media. The details of the ordeal are so horrifying that one questions how ingrained human cruelty is in Pakistan's social fabric. The fact that there are so many similar reports of breaking others down with impunity, and never being held accountable, should be something this nation should be ashamed of.

We wait for a time when the positives will outnumber the negatives for Pakistan's women. A time when she will not be easy prey. When she will not be blamed for being a victim. ## FAFEN URGES FAIR GEOGRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION ON SEATS RESERVED FOR WOMEN

Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN) on Thursday called for introducing divisional quotas for seats reserved for women in the National and Provincial Assemblies to ensure the geographical representativeness of women as well as to incentivize their greater political role in the areas where women's participation is marginal. In disregard to the spirit of the reservation i.e. greater representativeness, the existing method of considering the entire province as a single constituency for election on the reserved seats allows the political parties to select the candidates from any areas of their choice.

The findings were discussed in the first working group meeting of 'Inter-Provincial Working Group on Protecting Women's Marriage Rights'.

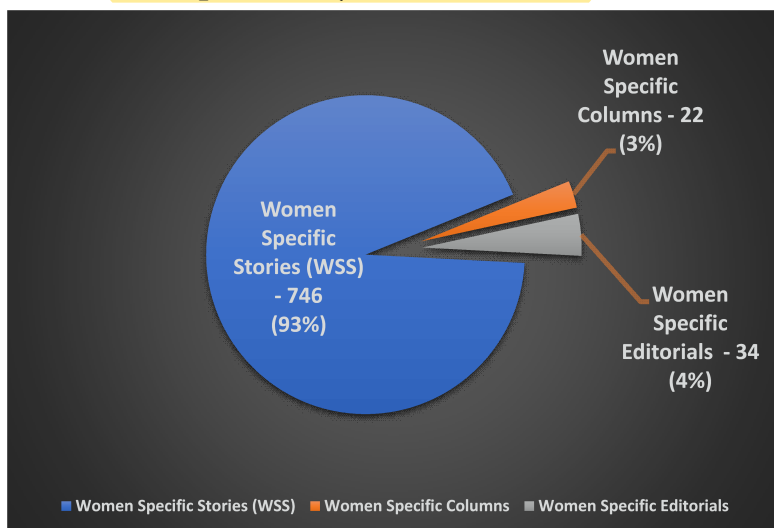

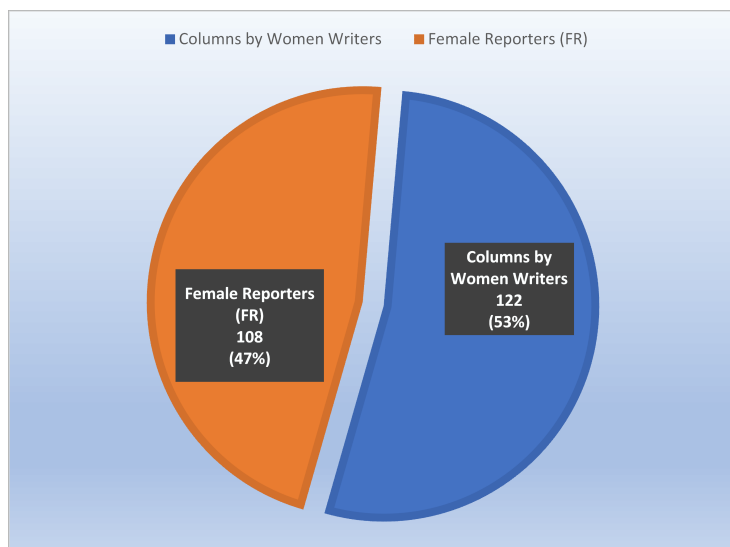

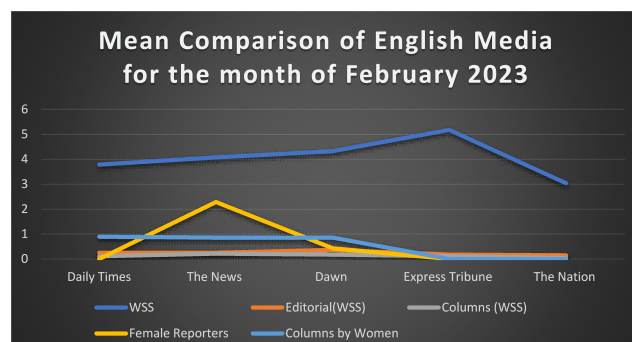

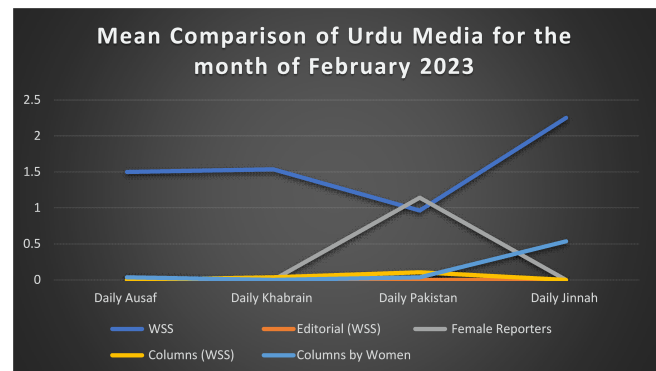
Graph 3: Mean Comparison of English Media

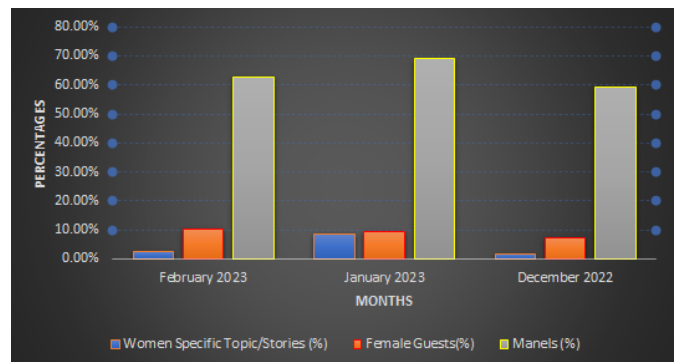

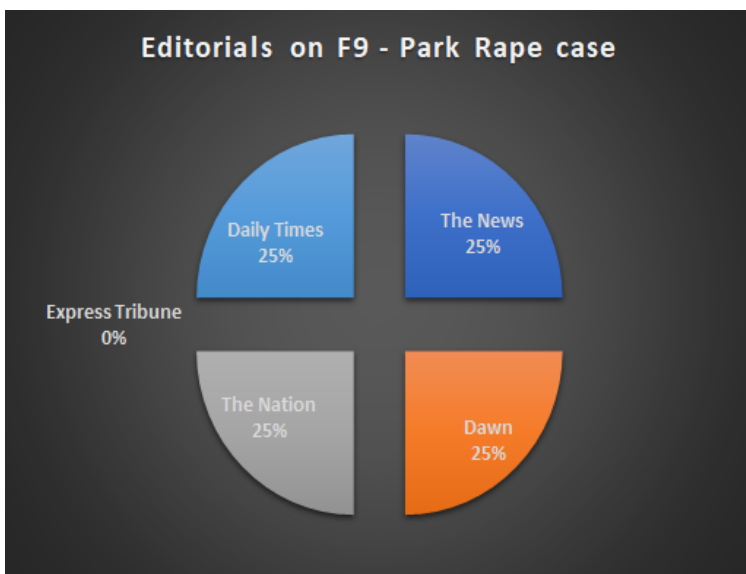

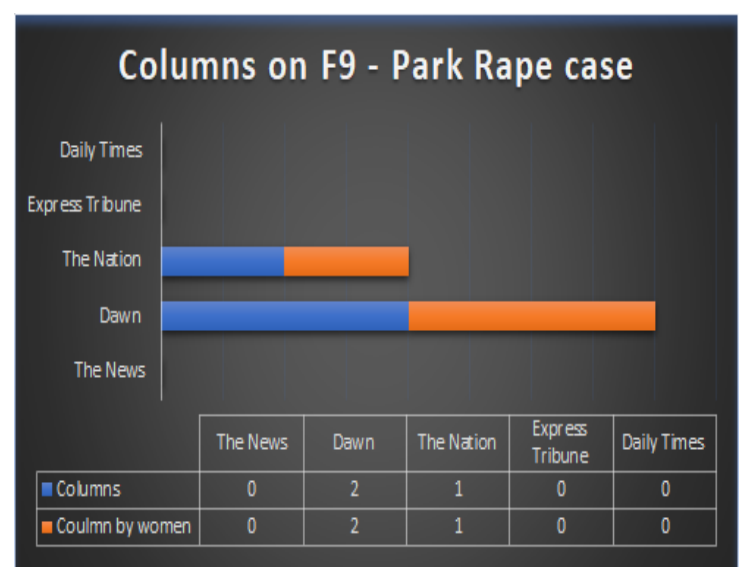
